Storypark is now available for your to download and archive your children's learning and we will continue using this platform until we return in 2024. Please ensure your child's Storypark portfolio is downloaded before 1 January, 2024 if you would like an online version of their learning portfolio for your personal use and keepsake memories.

A reminder from our kaiako about needing additional sets of clothing in your child's bag so that after water play we can make sure our tamariki are warm and dry. With the variable weather still persisting, we are keen to make sure tamariki are not in wet clothes for too long after their water play has finished. Sun hats are now compulsory for our tamariki if they wish to play outside, please make sure your tamariki has a hat they enjoy wearing so that they want to keep it on! We do have the beginnings of Country Kidz merch dropping in late November and this does include some fabulous sunhats that will be available in two sizes.
