CHILDREN'S CORNER - By Karen Grivan

PARTICULAR INTERESTS OF THE CHILDREN OVER THE PAST TERM HAVE INCLUDED:

Over the past few weeks, witches, monsters and other spooky characters have been a keen interest for many of the children. This started with a child noticing our hat stand with a sombrero hat perched on the top looking like "a witch". "Scary" games of making cackle sounds and teachers hiding behind the hat stand in the dark came next, and the children have loved going to check out the scary witch in small brave groups, and then running away "scared" together. Many have also enjoyed sharing this experience with their whanau too, on pick-up. We have extended this play with books along a similar line e.g. 'Hunting for Dragons' written by Bruce Whatley, in which shadows and objects grouped together sometimes appear as though they are something else altogether. Books about witches, monsters and dragons have also been popular.





There has been a lot of 3-D construction using the polydron (magnetic shapes) happening. This play supports the development of science, maths and technology concepts, e.g. through patterning, problem-solving, experimenting with size, shape, space and weight.

Sorting games have also been popular and especially a new sorting (into sets of sameness) game we have created using coloured plates and our small, plastic, people figures. Sorting games are maths rich, and concepts include spatial

awareness, creating patterns, classifying, algebraic thinking and planning.
